

Equity in Athletics Report-- South Mountain Community College

Academic year 2013 - 14

(Pursuant to 20 USC §1092(g))

I. **Enrollment:**

In the prior academic year, the college enrolled 592 full-time male students and 794 full-time female students. Of these students, 91 male students were participants on at least one intercollegiate athletic team, and 64 female students were participants on at least one intercollegiate athletic team.

II. **Expenses: (Total Expenses) not game day expenses**

The amount of total expenses for all teams was \$546,428. Of this amount, the amount of expenses incurred for:

Football was \$ N/A

Basketball was \$ 39,031 .

The amount of expenses incurred for all other men's sports combined was \$ 212,030 .

The amount of expenses generated from women's basketball was \$ 31,592.

The amount of expenses generated from all other women's sports combined was \$ 263,775 .

III. **Sports: Operating (Game-Day) Expenses**

A. **Baseball:** On this team, there were 35 participants. The total operating expenses were \$ 50,942 . The head coach is a male, and serves as a full-time employee.

Additionally, there are 2 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 2 are male; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time. Among the assistant coaches, 0 are women; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time.

B. **Basketball:** On this team, there were 15 participants. The total operating expenses were \$ 18,047 . The head coach is a male, and serves as a part-time employee.

Additionally, there are 2 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 2 are male; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time. Among the assistant coaches, 0 are women; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time.

C. **Soccer:** On this team, there were 30 participants. The total operating expenses were \$ 5,012 . The head coach is a male, and serves as a part-time employee.

Additionally, there are 1 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 1 are men; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time. Among

the assistant coaches, 0 are women; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time.

- D. **Golf:** On this team, there were 11 participants. The total operating expenses were \$ 15,149 . The head coach is a male, and serves as a full-time employee. Additionally, there are 0 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 0 are men; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time. Among the assistant coaches, 0 are women; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time.

- E. **Softball:** On this team, there were 19 participants. The total operating expenses were \$ 14,063 . The head coach is a female, and serves as a full-time employee. Additionally, there are 2 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 1 are male; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time. Among the assistant coaches, 1 are women; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time.
- F. **Basketball:** On this team, there were 11 participants. The total operating expenses were \$ 12,929 . The head coach is a female, and serves as a part-time employee. Additionally, there are 1 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 0 are male; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time. Among the assistant coaches, 1 are women; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time.
- G. **Soccer:** On this team, there were 18 participants. The total operating expenses were \$ 6,338 . The head coach is a male, and serves as a part-time employee. Additionally, there is 1 assistant coach for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 1 male; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time. Among the assistant coaches, 0 are women; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time.
- H. **Golf:** On this team, there were 4 participants. The total operating expenses were \$ 2,514 . The head coach is a male, and serves as a full-time employee. Additionally, there are 0 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 0 are men; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time. Among the assistant coaches, 0 are women; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time.
- I. **Volleyball:** On this team, there were 12 participants. The total operating expenses were \$ 18,690 . The head coach is a male, and serves as a full-time employee. Additionally, there are 2 assistant coaches for this sport. Among the assistant coaches, 0 are men; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time. Among the assistant coaches, 2 are women; 0 of them are full-time and the others are part-time.

IV. Student Aid:

The college spent a total amount of \$ 70,200 on athletically related student aid, including the value of waivers. Of this amount, \$ 31,200 was spent on aid for men's teams and

\$39,000 was spent on aid for women's teams. The ratio of athletically related aid awarded male athletes to that awarded female athletes was 43% male/ 57% female .

V. Recruiting:

The college spent a total amount of \$ 0 on recruiting. Of this amount, \$ 0 was spent on recruiting for men's teams and \$ 0 was spent on recruiting for women's teams.

VI. Salaries:

The average salary of head coaches for men's teams was \$ 19,762 . The average salary of head coaches for women's teams was \$ 24,686. The average salary of assistant coaches for men's teams was \$ 2,380 . The average salary of assistant coaches for women's teams was \$ 2,523 .

VII. Revenues:

The amount of total revenues generated for all teams was \$592,278 . Of this amount, the amount of revenues generated for men's teams was \$ 270,674 and the amount of revenues generated for women's teams was \$ 321,604

The amount of revenues generated from football was \$ N/A .

The amount of revenues generated from men's basketball was \$ 42,308.

The amount of revenues generated from all other men's sports combined was \$ 228,366 .

The amount of revenues generated from women's basketball was \$ 35,625 .

The amount of revenues generated from all other women's sports combined was \$ 285,979.
